The Graduate Certificate in Primary STEM Education will equip teaching graduates with the skills, knowledge and dispositions to develop expertise as a teacher within the primary school setting. Teachers will develop science and STEM pedagogical content knowledge, practical knowledge for helping students work scientifically and technologically, and strong understanding of the importance of research-based enquiry to inform their teaching. Additionally, the Graduate Certificate will develop teachers' skills in developing integrated STEM learning experiences for students. The program is suitable for Primary and lower Secondary teachers.
