

# GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN URBAN MANAGEMENT (HEALTHY PLACES) (1899)

This program applies to students who commenced in 2023 or later.

The Graduate Certificate in Urban Management (Healthy Places) equips students with the professional and scholarly education needed to lead urban management, strategic planning and policy development for healthy cities. Students will develop knowledge of how cities can be designed to promote health and wellbeing, including planning for active and sustainable places. They will develop skills in health advancement and promotion and develop the practical and theoretical knowledge required to address health inequality within cities.

## Admission

Applicants must have successfully completed an undergraduate degree, or higher, in any discipline;

OR

Have a minimum of five (5) years full-time equivalent professional work experience in planning, geography, social science, environmental studies, architecture and landscape studies, urban and regional studies, public policy, health, sport or recreation and exercise science.

Applicants seeking admission on the basis of work experience must support their application with a Statement of Service for all work experience listed on the application.
