

# MASTER OF MEDICINE (CHILD HEALTH) (4804)

This program applies to students who commenced in mid year 2025 or later.

The Master of Medicine (Child Health) is a comprehensive program designed to enhance the expertise of medical practitioners in the field of child and adolescent health. This program blends advanced theoretical knowledge with practical clinical reasoning skills, focusing on the diagnosis and management of paediatric conditions. Students will develop the core epidemiological and statistical skills needed to design and carry out research, and to advance their training in paediatric medicine. Every aspect of the program is designed, developed and assessed by experienced academics and experts from Western Sydney University and the Sydney Children's Hospitals Network.

## Early Exit
