This program provides students with the specialist knowledge and skills required to shape the future of the tourism, hospitality and event management sectors in Australia and internationally. Graduates will be equipped to deliver sustainability and innovation outcomes through working in a variety of managerial, operational, policy, planning and research roles. The program allows students to complete majors in a variety of themes, including: human resource management, innovation and entrepreneurship, management, marketing, and planning and place making. Students are provided pathways to employment through work placements, applied projects and opportunities to engage with high-profile industry and government partners.

Early Exits

Students may exit with a 1937 Graduate Diploma in Sustainable Tourism, Hospitality and Event Management (exit only) (<https://hbook.westernsydney.edu.au/archives/2024-2025/programs/graduate-diploma-sustainable-tourism-hospitality-event-management-exit-only/#text>) upon completion of at least 80 credit points as specified in the graduate diploma (exit only) program structure.

Admission

160cp Master of Sustainable Tourism, Hospitality and Event Management (2 years full-time, or equivalent)

Applicants must have successfully completed

- a bachelor degree, or higher, in any discipline; **OR**
- an advanced diploma, or equivalent, in tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage, geography, social science, cultural studies, humanities, business, environmental management, or a related discipline **AND** five years full-time equivalent work experience at a managerial or professional level in roles related to tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage and/or the visitor economy.

120cp Master of Sustainable Tourism, Hospitality and Event Management (1.5 years full-time, or equivalent)

Applicants must have successfully completed

- a bachelor degree, or higher, in tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage, geography, social science, cultural studies, humanities, business, environmental management, or a related discipline; **OR**
- a bachelor degree, or higher, in any discipline **AND** a minimum of two years full-time equivalent work experience in roles related to tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage and/or the visitor economy; **OR**
- a bachelor degree, or higher, in any discipline **AND** a minimum of five years full-time equivalent general work experience; **OR**
- an advanced diploma, or equivalent, in tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage, geography, social science, cultural studies, humanities, business, environmental management, or a related discipline **AND** five years full-time equivalent work experience at a managerial or professional level in roles related to tourism, hospitality, event management, heritage and/or the visitor economy.

80cp Master of Sustainable Tourism, Hospitality and Event Management (1 year full-time or equivalent)

Applicants must have successfully completed

- an honours degree, graduate certificate, graduate diploma or higher, in tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage, geography, social science, cultural studies, humanities, business, environmental management, or a related discipline; **OR**
- a bachelor degree in tourism, heritage, geography, social science, cultural studies, humanities, business, hospitality, events, environmental management, or a related discipline **AND** a minimum of two years full-time equivalent work experience in roles related to tourism, travel, hospitality, event management, heritage and/or visitor economy.

Applicants seeking admission on the basis of work experience must support their application with a Statement of Service for all work experience listed on the application.

Successful completion of this pathway requires the completion of 80 credit points of core and focus subjects, and 40 credit points of elective subjects. Students can complete an additional elective subject if they do not wish to complete an industry placement. Elective subjects can
